Lastly we had some discussion on the day about team eligibility from overseas teams in that it wasn't clear to some of them that teams had to come from one club to be competitive, for which I apologise. This needs to be stated more clearly for future events, for now we ensured that those from different clubs were shown in the actual finishing order but marked as non-competitive.
