Whether you are planning something active, social or a cultural experience, please follow the process below:

**Understand** your impact on the landscape

> **Our process** applies to providers, groups or organisations of any scale including: charities, CICS and commercial

Check the type of land you will be using

This could one or a combination of:

- National Trust land or buildings
- Public Right of Way
- Land with protected status (often SSSI)

OS maps and Natural England's Designated Sites page will give you most of the information vou need.

You may be asked to complete an **Exchange of** Information form to gather more details. We will also advise on any further actions at this stage.

#### You will require one for:

- Using land that is off the public right of way (including car parks)
- Using land that is a protected status (eg SSSI)
- Selling food, beverages or alcohol
- Playing music

#### We may also ask you for:

- Public Liability Insurance
- Employers Liability Insurance
- Risk Assessment

We may be able to share some conservation or cultural stories that vour participants might enjoy whilst they are with you



# Responsible Experiences Provider Scheme

### **Some examples:**

There are lots of different possible scenarios, which is why it's important to speak with the National Trust team so they can understand your situation and advise you. Here are some of the most common arrangements.



**Start/Finish point and waymarkers** 

An organised race or walk is using public right of way trails. You will need a simple agreement to put up start/finish gazebos and any waymarking signs. Also think about the impact of large volumes of people on the landscape/nature.



Forest Schools and outdoor workshops

You want to run educational activities or workshops. You will need to let us know and may need a specific agreement.



Making and creating things

You are planning a creative activity at or inspired by a National Trust place (including photography). If the intended use is commercial, you will need an agreement in place.



Sales: food, drinks, merchandise, alcohol

You are organising some concession stands for your participants. You need to share your plans so we can make sure any additional statutory permissions have been applied for and are in place.



Please don't use the National Trust's logo and branding on your promotional materials unless this has been specifically agreed with you. This is only permitted when we are co-hosts or it is a strategically important event.
