

British Orienteering - Selection Policy 2026

1. Purpose

- 1.1. This is the selection policy for athletes to the Great Britain (GB) team for all international competitions into which British Orienteering enters teams based on the aims and objectives of the British Orienteering Performance Programme.

2. Aim of the British Orienteering Performance Programme

- 2.1. The overall aim of the Performance programme is to maximise GB success at the World and European Orienteering Championships (WOC and EOC).
- 2.2. The objectives of the Performance programme are to:
 - Support and prepare our athletes to deliver medals and top-10 positions at WOC/EOC 2026
 - Develop athletes towards medal performances at major championships in 2027 and beyond
- 2.3. The only other competition with a performance focus is the Junior World Orienteering Championships (JWOC), although this is secondary to WOC and EOC.

3. General information

- 3.1. All selections for international competitions will use the selection criteria outlined in section 6.
- 3.2. Team selection for senior internationals will prioritise athletes who demonstrate the potential to meet the primary Performance Programme objectives (e.g. top-10 results at WOC and EOC 2026). Remaining places may be allocated to developing athletes for experience and to support their long-term competitive progress.
- 3.3. The selectors may choose not to select for all available positions at a competition if they feel that the standard of an athlete will not contribute towards the overall aims and objectives of the Performance Programme.
- 3.4. For each competition a Team Manager will be identified. From the point of arrival at the competition, the Team Manager has a duty of care to the athletes and may, in the best interests of the athletes and team, and in consultation with other staff in attendance at the competition, rest or withdraw an athlete from a race. Another athlete may be substituted if the Team Manager believes this is appropriate. Where practical, the Team Manager should seek agreement from the Performance Pathway Manager prior to making any team changes.
- 3.5. For EYOC and JEC, athletes will not be selected to 'run-up', e.g. M/W 16s will not be selected to compete in the M/W18 category at EYOC. For JWOC, only M/W18 and M/W20 athletes will be considered for selection.
- 3.6. **Relay teams**
The selection panel will either name a relay team in advance, or the team(s) will be selected by the competition staff during the competition, supported by Performance Programme Staff as necessary. A preselected team can be changed.
- 3.7. **Reserves**
For each competition the selection panel will consider, in the same selection meeting, what, if any, reserves should be named. These may be traveling or non-travelling reserves.
- 3.8. **Availability**
All athletes who wish to be selected for a competition should declare their availability for that competition. **This is done by completing an online form:** <https://forms.gle/fk98r4rPHKR8Hh2a8>. Athletes declaring availability for WUOC must also complete a BUCS availability form (details tbc). It is the athletes' responsibility to submit an availability form prior to the relevant availability deadline (details in the table below).

3.9. Mitigating circumstances

If an athlete with a realistic chance of meeting the aims and objectives of the Performance Programme has any mitigating circumstances which mean they are unable to participate in a selection race, or they encounter an issue out of their control at a selection race, the athlete should inform the selection panel in writing as soon as possible.

3.10. Force Majeure

British Orienteering reserve the right to withdraw all or part of a team, or change the selection policy, in response to abnormal situations beyond the control of the sport, including, but not limited to pandemics, terrorist threats or environmental disasters.

- 5.2. British Orienteering operates a formal appeals procedure for challenging the selection process which can be found at www.britishorienteering.org.uk/selection, or is available on request from the British Orienteering National Office.

6. Selection Criteria

- Performance and performance data (time behind winner etc.) from the selection races listed below will be taken into account. Only if necessary to separate athletes, or if something unforeseen occurs (e.g. a misplaced control due to organiser-error), will additional information such as split times and GPS traces be used.
- 2025 and 2026 international performances will also be considered at each selection stage.
- For Knock-Out Sprint selections, the initial consideration will be the likelihood of athletes qualifying for the knock-out stage of the competition, with any demonstrated head-to-head racing performance taken into consideration thereafter.

In addition, the following may be taken into consideration:

- Performances in WOC 2024 and EOC 2024.
- Whether an athlete has clearly demonstrated the potential to podium at the next three WOCs.
- Development opportunities for athletes who are potentially top 10 athletes in future WOCs and who will benefit from the experience.
- Evidence of athlete progression (or otherwise) over the last two years.
- Other data that provide evidence of competitive potential this season.
- Adherence to the Code of Conduct and any outstanding disciplinary matters.

The criteria above are not listed in any order of priority and those involved in selecting will exercise discretion fairly and without bias in making selection decisions.

In all cases, selectors may consider (and may require) additional evidence of athlete fitness. Where past international performances play a role in selection, athletes may be asked to demonstrate that their physical fitness is at a similar level to their fitness at that time.

The selection panel, at their discretion, may choose to select some athletes for a competition prior to the selection meeting dates listed below.

A2. Eligibility

To be eligible to be selected for a competition, each athlete must:

- Hold a valid British passport and be eligible to represent Great Britain in accordance with the rules of the IOF
- Hold a valid and current membership of British Orienteering
- Meet the age class requirements of the competition on 31st December in the year of competition
- Not be serving a period of ineligibility because of an anti-doping rule violation
- Complete anti-doping training as requested by British Orienteering and/or the IOF
- Meet any additional eligibility requirements that apply for WUOC

Any athlete who is the subject of an outstanding disciplinary matter is ineligible for selection until the matter reaches an agreed resolution. The selection panel must be satisfied that the selection of any athlete will not jeopardise the efficient, safe and orderly management of the group and/or individual during the competition.

A3. Anti-Doping

All selected athletes must comply with the UK Anti-Doping Rules as published by UK Anti-Doping Limited (or its successor): [The Anti-Doping Rules | UK Anti-Doping \(ukad.org.uk\)](#)

A4. Selection Panel Roles

The Selection Panel will exercise discretion fairly and without bias.

The Selection Panel will consist of the following (not exclusively):

- Chair
- Vice-Chair
- Performance Pathway Manager
- Selectors
- Selection Advisors
- Scrutineer

The role of the Chair is to:

1. Coordinate Selection meetings and ensure all members are fully briefed in advance.
2. Chair the Selection meetings and ensure a formal record of the meeting is taken.
3. This is a voting position.

The role of the Vice-Chair is to:

1. Chair all or part of a selection meeting if the Chair declares a conflict of interest.
2. The Vice Chair is a member of the selection panel who has delegated responsibility to chair all or part of a selection meeting.

The role of the Performance Pathway Manager is to:

1. Ensure selections reflect the Performance programme's aims set by British Orienteering.
2. Ensure up-to-date information is available to the Selection Panel for all relevant athletes, including from Squad Managers, coaches, and other experts (e.g. medics) as appropriate.
3. Maintain a full record of all performance information relevant to the selection criteria, and make sure this is available at Selection meetings.
4. As requested, provide support to the Chair in matters of selection. This may include providing selection proposals ahead of the meeting
5. This is a voting position.

The role of a Selector is to:

1. Provide advice to the Panel, based on the criteria described in this document, regarding selection of athletes to international events at which GBR competes.
2. Challenge the selections presented to the Panel and ensure selections reflect and apply the selection philosophy, overview and criteria set by British Orienteering.
3. As requested, provide support to the Chair in matters of selection.
4. This is a voting position.

The role of a Selection Advisor is:

1. As per the Selector, but this is a non-voting position. In short, advisors advise, but selectors decide.

The role of the Scrutineer is to:

1. Ensure selections accurately represent the data presented
2. Ensure that the selection philosophy, overview and criteria set by British Orienteering is fairly and consistently applied.
3. As requested, provide support to the Chair regarding the interpretation and application of the selection policy.
4. This is a non-voting position.

The Selection Panel may choose to delegate selection to an appropriate person(s) but will retain responsibility and accountability for all selection decisions. British Orienteering reserves the right to identify possible future Selection Panel members and involve them as observers in meetings, so they may familiarise themselves with the selection process.

Conflict of Interest: Any panel member must declare any conflicts, or potential conflicts, of interest and shall refrain from participation in the discussion of, or any vote, in respect of any selection matter in which they have a material conflict of interest. If the Chair of Selectors declares a conflict of interest, the Vice Chair will step in and chair the relevant part of the meeting. The Scrutineer will be responsible for ensuring that any conflicts of interest are managed fairly and without bias.

Meetings: The Panel may conduct the meeting by means of a telephone or video conference, allowing all persons to hear each other at the same time. Such participation shall constitute presence in-person at such meetings.

Quorum: The quorum for every decision is a minimum of three members.

Voting: The Chair only has one vote. The Chair may choose not to vote despite being entitled to do so as a member. If there is not a majority, the Chair of the meeting has the casting vote.

Communication: It is the responsibility of the Performance Pathway Manager to communicate selection decisions to athletes. It is important that members of the panel do not become involved in communicating with athletes and personal coaches any matters of selection other than to refer any queries to the Performance Pathway Manager.
